## Attendance



As we begin a new academic year, we would like to remind parents and carers that children who have frequent absences from school have gaps in their learning, miss social time with friends, and engage in fewer enrichment activities. The impact of this on student outcomes is significant, with lower attainment at GCSE which can affect long-term life chances. Every student should be aiming for at least 95% attendance in each school year and even that equates to fifty lessons missed.

One in 13 children, or roughly two in every classroom, has a food allergy.

 Nuts are the allergen that are most likely to cause a life threatening allergic reaction. Allergic reactions often cause a life threatening state of shock called anaphylaxis. It typically needs immediate medical attention. Since there is no cure for an allergic reaction, the best way to avoid anaphylaxis is through prevention of exposure.

At Maghull High School we are ensuring that our school community is a nut free school.

We ask you to carefully consider what you are putting in your lunchbox, or the snacks you are bringing in.




### Student Spotlight: Daniel Johnson-Kenny
